Message from "Right to Life UK"

Children's Liturgy of the Word to resume



Children's Liturgy at St Andrew's is due to resume after a break of several years. Two dedicated parishioners now have all of their PVG clearances and will run a first Children's Liturgy of the Word in the Church hall during a Mass in February (date to be confirmed). Any children are welcome to go to the hall with the two

leaders when Fr Gerald gives the signal after the start of Mass and they will be accompanied back into the Church before Communion. Parents are welcome to attend if they would like to meet the leaders and accompany their children at first. The children will have an opportunity to learn about the weekly Word in language which is more accessible for them. Please catch Fr Gerald or phone into the Parish Office on Fridays if you have any queries.

Please also speak with Fr Gerald or call into the office if you would be willing to have the PVG checks with a view to helping out with the Children's Liturgy so that it can run weekly again rather than roughly monthly to fit with the commitments of the two new leaders. The dates of Children's Liturgy sessions will be intimated in the bulletin.

Fr Kyuka Education Fund

From Jo Kemp: "We have sent £1200 to Fr Frederick in Uganda. Last year it helped two students at university, one studying Food Processing and the other Economics

For those who are new to the parish, Fr Frederick used to come every summer to provide holiday cover for our priest. Thus began our involvement with educating Fr Frederick's young relatives as his siblings had died in the AIDS epidemic. We began a fund to help Fr Frederick's family continue their studies. We paid for 6 youngsters to complete their education. Since then the Christians in Uganda have felt their values were being undermined and a university was founded. I am not sure of the details but we are now helping underfunded students on an ad hoc basis.

Many thanks to those who have contributed over the past 15 plus years to make a huge difference to the young people. Supporters pay £5 to £20 per month into the Kyuka Fund account and I usually transfer whatever we have into Fr Frederick's account in January.
